At the present time across Canada, The Canadian Red Cross Society is engaged in a campaign to raise a total of \$3,000,000. Here at Terrace Bay an organization has been set up to raise a minimum of \$1000. which is the objective set for us by District Headquarters at Port Arthur. As we are approached for a donation or have the opportunity of contributing to this worthy cause, let us bear in mind the

fact that when we give we actually become a partner in all the missions of mercy carried out by Canada's skilled, devoted Red Cross workers. Without funds, the Red Cross could not carry on.

Apart from the fact that Red Cross services are now established in many humanitarian fields, one of the most important features of Red Cross work is Blood Transfusion Service. This year promises to be a "red letter" year in the extension of this Free Service in Canada.

Individuals can claim a tax deduction on funds donated to the Red Cross (up to 10% of income). Official receipts will be issued for income tax purposes. Persons contributing \$1.00 or more automatically become members of The Canadian Red Cross Society.

A Campaign Bulletin Board has been established in the Post Office to record progress of the six divisions as well as the Terrace Bay campaign total.
