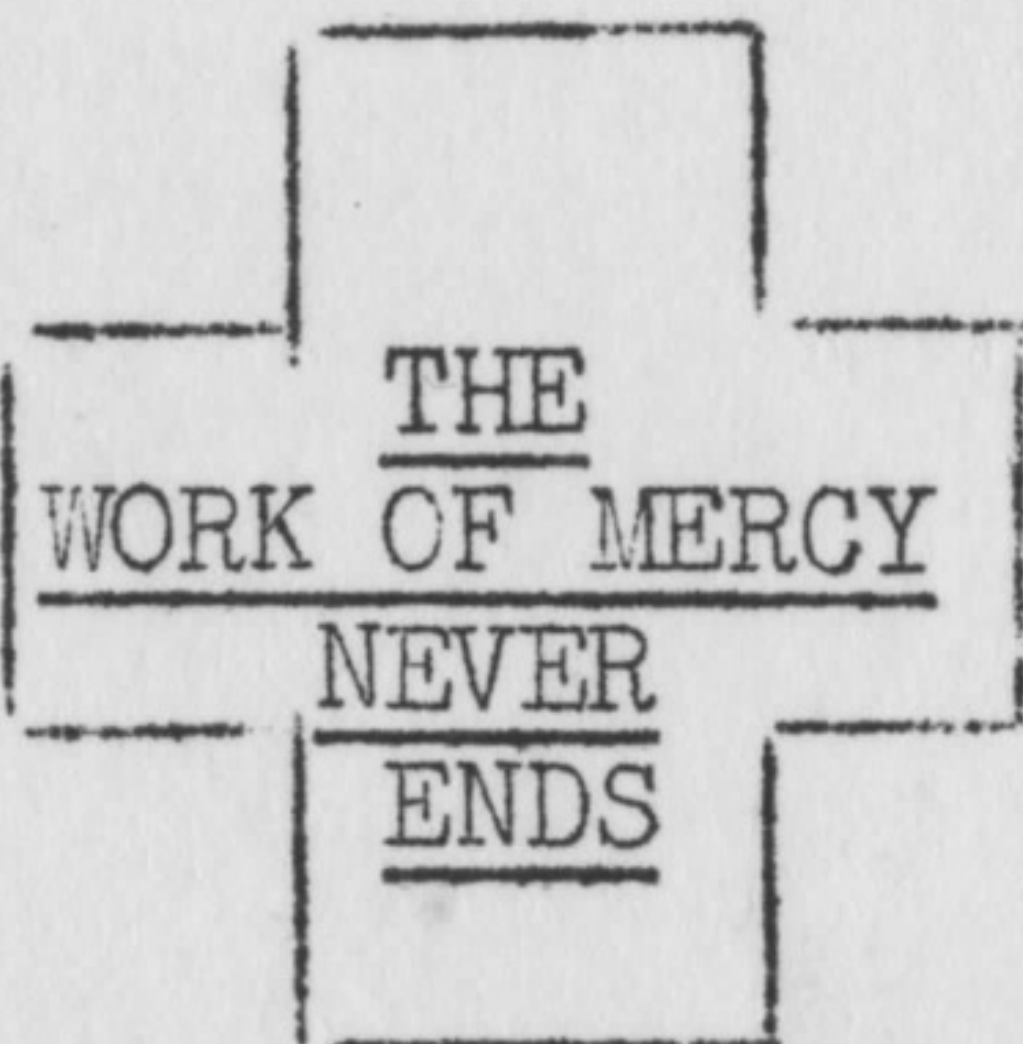


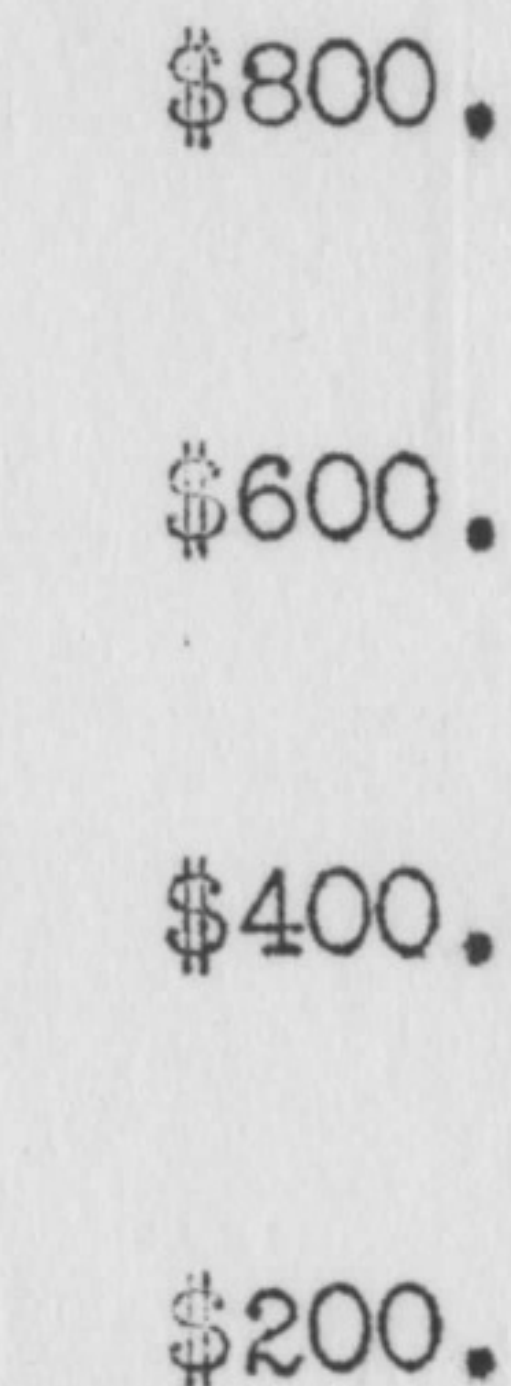
EIGHTY PERCENT MARK PASSED IN TERRACE BAY RED CROSS CAMPAIGN
