Most ladder accidents are caused by the ladder falling or the climber losing his balance and falling. Here are some important precautions.

1. Make sure the ladder is not defective and that 'it is equipped

with the proper safety feet for floor or ground.


2. Tie ladder at base if floor is slippery.

3. Always face the ladder and hold on with both hands when climbing up or down.

4. Be sure ladder is placed at a safe angle (75 degrees) when it

is used against a wall or other solid backing.

If your shoes are muddy or slippery, clean before climbing.
