AGUASABON RIVER UP TWELVE FEET Since water in the Aguasabon River started to rise with the spring thaw, the level has come up 12 feet. Much of the was a rise of 28 inches. It was during this particular period that it was necessary to take speedy action to move the emergency pump at the river just north of the jackladder location. Thirty-five men worked from 7:00 p.m. Monday to 3:00 a.m. Tuesday to remove the heavy pump from its flooded location and it was not until Wednesday morning that the relocated pump was hooked into the emergency water line thus assuring an adequate supply of water in case of fire.
