TERRACE BAY VOTERS LIST  
BEING COMPILED MAY 10TH

Notices of preparation of a Voters list at Terrace Bay have been posted and next Monday, May 10th, two enumerators L. D. Brunton and W. J. Linden will be on hand. All persons qualified to vote at the pending Provincial Election are called upon "to attend at the times and places hereinunder mentioned for the purpose of having their names enrolled upon the Voters Lists to be used at the said elections". The enumerators will be on hand on the 10th between 6:00 p.m. and 9:00 p.m. at the Recreation Centre in the Lower Camp and Dining Hall #5 in the Upper Camp. We have been advised by Judge A. H. Dowler, Chairman of the Election Board for the Electoral District of Port Arthur that under Section 119 of the Voters List Act, persons in the Improvement District of Terrace Bay must qualify as follows: (1) Be of the full age of 21 years before election day (June 7th). (2) Be a British Subject and not disqualified from voting by law. (3) Be a resident of, or be domiciled in the electoral district. (4) Be a resident of the Province of Ontario for a period of 12 months preceding the election.

Following compilation of the Voters List at Terrace Bay, it is expected that a revising officer will come to the community following posting of the lists to make any necessary revisions.
