According to information just received from the Taxation Division of the Department of National Revenue, 1943 and 1944 refundable savings cheques will be mailed by March 31, 1949. In order that everyone who is entitled to a refundable savings cheque may receive theirs on time, every effort is being made through a coast-to-coast publicity campaign to urge all taxpayers who have changed their address since 1943 to so advise the Department. The importance of public co-operation cannot be ever emphasized since tracing taxpayers who are entitled to refundable savings cheques throws a heavy burden upon the Department of National Revenue. When the 1942 refundable savings cheques were distributed, more than 450,000 persons had to be traced in order to insure delivery of the cheques and since the current campaign represents over twice as many taxpayers as last year, the problem involved should be readily appreciated.

If you have changed your name or address since 1943 and are entitled to a refundable savings cheque for either or both of the 1943 - 1944 tax periods, make it a point to fill out the special "Change of Address" card available at all Post Offices. These cards should be mailed before October 31, 1948 to the Taxation Division, Department of National

Revenue, Ottawa.
