<u>BUY CANADA SAVINGS BONDS</u> By the time this appears in print the majority of LongLac employees will have been approached by a fellow employee with regard to the purchase of Third Series Canada Savings Bonds. These bonds may be purchased by cash or on the payroll savings plan, with payments spread over a six or twelve month period. While no "pressure methods" have been used to encourage bond buying, it should be obvious to all that regular saving is a powerful factor in the financial stability of my individual and should therefore be encouraged. While bond sales are going well at Terrace Bay, final figures will not be available for some days. For those who will be doing last minute purchasing the following facts may be important: the bonds pay interest for a ten year period at $2\frac{3}{4}$; they may be cashed at any bank, at any time for the full face value plus interest to date; the bonds must be registered in the name of one individual only. Total purchases may not exceed \$1000.00 in any one name, although each member of a family is entitled to hold up to the \$1000.00 limit. The bonds come in convenient amounts of \$50.00, \$100.00, \$500,00 and \$1000.00.
