DO NOT START TAGS Throughout the mill at the present time on many valves and switches, one often sees "DO NOT START" tags. Across each tag in white letters on a red oval with a black border is the word DANGER. There is a space for the signature of the party installing the tag, also wording indicating that the tag is there for a very good reason. Someone is working on a machine or some piece of equipment or a valve has been closed for a purpose. Quite often when such a tag is installed a workman is depending entirely on it for his safety and in many cases for his life. Small wonder then that the tag also carries the wording "DO NOT REMOVE THIS TAG. To do so without authority will mean immediate discharge". The reason for such a strict regulation is obvious.
