BUS SCHEDULE REVISED AND FURTHER EXTENDED Bus service at Terrace Bay, operated by International Transit Co. will be extended

commencing December 1st to include an enlarged "Townsite Loop" which will take in the Hudson Drive curve, MacDonald Avenue and the North half of Kenogami Road. In all, there will be eight scheduled townsite stops instead of the four as at present. On and after December 1st a flat fare of 10¢ per ride will be charged by the Bus Company for service between the "Townsite Loop" and the Millsite.

The revised schedule and details covering the enlarged "Townsite Loop" are published on page 4 of this paper, and everyone using bus service is urged to save the schedule for

future reference.
