

SNOW REMOVAL FROM DRIVEWAYS The matter of snow removal from driveways to facilitate coal delivery to townsite houses has been a matter of concern to many who have been faced with the chore of shovelling tons of snow. In order to ease the situation the Company has developed a bulldozer service which will be available under certain conditions at a nominal charge.

Whenever the bulldozer is in the Townsite area, and providing that the work load will permit it, driveways will be bulldozed for \$1.00.

If a special trip to the Townsite is necessary in order to do the job, the rate charged will of necessity be higher (\$9.00 per hour) and time will be charged from the time the bulldozer leaves to do the job until it returns.

With the development of an overall committee in mind, the question of a Terrace Bay Recreation Association is raised and in all probability a Board of Directors or Executive of a Recreation Association would be the logical group to co-ordinate all recreational matters.

On Thursday, Feb. 24th at 8:00 p.m. for the purpose dealing with the organizing of the Terrace Bay Recreation Association, a meeting will be held in the Recreation Hall; A special program is being arranged for the occasion and at the meeting a Steering Committee, Executive or Board of Directors will be elected. In the meantime, residents of the community are urged to carefully consider the importance of this development and come to the meeting prepared to elect a committee which will be of real service to the community.
