courses commenced on Monday, February 21st. Each course is conducted for a three-hour period daily, Monday through Friday, with the Afternoon Course operating from 2:00 p.m. to 5:00 p.m., and the Evening Course from 7:00 p.m. to 10:00 p.m. The classes are being held in a room of the new Terrace Bay school which was made available for the purpose by the Terrace Bay School Board. Twelve full-size looms have been set up for the course which is being conducted by Miss Elizabeth Banigan of the Community Programs Branch of the Department of Education, Toronto.

In the past, weaving courses such as these have involved a total of 8 hours participation per day over the three week period, but due to numerous requests for shorter courses, an experiment is being conducted at Terrace Bay whereby it will be determined whether or not the short three-hour per day course will be satisfactory to all concerned.

By the time the three-week course here is completed each of the sixteen ladies who are taking it will have learned to weave approximately 25 separate patterns.
