TERRACE BAY MASONIC LODGE INSTITUTED

During the evening, at Hotel Terrace, wives of visiting Masons were entertained by all wives of local Masons.

On Sunday morning, visitors were given an opportunity of seeing the principal sights and points of interest in the area and a dinner was held in Hotel Terrace at noon.

Sunday afternoon was marked by a church parade and attendance at divine service held in Terrace Bay Community Church with Rev. A. F. Lavender officiating. Prayers were offered by Rev. H. Crawley, chaplain of the new lodge and Rev. H. Seegmiller of Geraldton, District Chaplain of the Masonic order, delivered the sermon. A solo was rendered by Mrs. W. Lavender. Mrs. T. Stanley Hodgkiss was pianist for the service.
