The Services Department is responsible for ordering all incoming raw materials, supplies and maintenance items and the warehousing of same also for loading and shipping the finished product. Services performed by janitors, watchmen, mobile equipment operators and garbage collectors also come within the jurisdiction of this Department.

Personnel Department Services and Company Benefits

In addition to its normal responsibilities regarding employment, promotions, administration of the labour agreement, safety, first aid a nd other related matters, the Personnel Department interprets to all employees facts concerning the varied espects of such Company benefits as are available to each employee. These benefits include the "Blue Cross Plan for Hospital Care", Group Life Insurance, Employees' Mutual B enefit Society and local Group Medical Plan. The Department also takes responsibility for the publishing of a weekly mimeographed newspaper "Terrace Bay News."
