CREDIT UNION NEWS All deposits and all loans in the local Credit Union are insured. This means that, if you have share holdings in the Credit Union and you should happen to die, then, this amount is immediately doubled (up to \$1,000.00) and the total money is paid to your beneficiary. Thus you have a practical double-indemnity insurance policy at NO COST to you. In the case of loans, the full amount of the loan is insured and thus if a member dies whilst still owing part or all of a loan, then the debt is immediately cancelled and the beneficiaries do NOT pay towards it. At the same time, these insurances protect the local Credit Union against any loss. These insurances are made through the CUNA Mutual Insurance Company.

The Terrace Bay Credit Union also has an automobile insurance plan for its members. Full details of this will be published at a later date.

The Credit Union is also considering a hospital and Medical plan for its members as soon as the membership warrants it.

All these advantages are gained, simply because this is a co-operative, mutual, organization whereby all members benefit directly.
