CHRISTMAS TREES Once again the attention of our residents is drawn to the matter of cutting Christmas trees. If you insist upon cutting your own tree, please be sure that you pick one that is not in the area defined as follows: from the Aquasabon River on the west to the Firebreak on the east and from Lake Superior on the south to the old Highway #17 on the north.

In order to make sure that everybody gets the tree that they want, the local Boy Scout Troop are organized to supply trees for the entire Townsite. If you desire to purchase your tree from the Scouts and have it delivered to your door by them, all you have to do is phone Mason Dixon at 58, Earle Veitch at his office - Local #1 or Ossie Dalzell at Local #53 and give the following details: type - spruce or balsam, size and date of delivery. No deliveries prior to December 10th. Amount of payment will be on a voluntary basis. Pay the Scouts when your tree is delivered. Have a look at your tree and pay what you think is a fair price.
