NEW BANK BUILDING MAKES PROGRESS Your operator had the pleasure of having a conducted tour through the partially completed new Imperial Bank building in the Townsite. When finished, this new addition to our Townsite services will certainly be a credit to the Community. The Main floor will be completely taken up with teller's cages, counters, manager's office, vault, safety deposit boxes, coupon-clipping booths, etc., while the basement will be divided into sections comprising storage vaults, snack preparation accomodation for the male staff, plus a large Recreation Room for the Bank staff. On the second floor will be the large, spacious and completely modern apartment for the Manager. In addition, there will be a three-room suite of living quarters for the male staff which will be equally up-to-date.

This new structure will be completely modern in every respect including air-conditioning of the main floor and basement as well as being steam heated by the Central Heating Plant. All in all this will be a welcome addition to our fast-growing little town.
