PRODUCTION WITH SAFETY The month of March just completed, saw all previous production and safety records shattered, proving conclusively that we can have "PRODUCTION WITH SAFETY", a theme on which attention has been focused for the past seven months. Everyone associated with the LongLac Pulp and Paper Company may justifiably be pleased with the performance which saw an average of 308.44 tons of pulp produced each day (a 4.4% increase over our best previous month) while accidents were reduced to five doctor-care cases, a 16.6% improvement over the safest month ever experienced at Terrace Bay.
