(3) To pay off this loan you can turn over the subsequent Baby Bonus cheques to the Credit Union. When the loan is paid off you'll find that you will have the "Saving" habit and thus you'll find it easy to continue turning over the Cheques as they come in and thus further build up your share capital.

(4) When the loan is paid off you'll have the clothes that you bought, plus the

money that you started with. (The Share Capital).

(5) The full amount of your share capital is still in the Credit Union and has been all along and is earning a dividend payable at the end of the year.
