FORT WILLIAM MALE CHOIR CONCERT, SATURDAY JUNE 10TH The first Community Concert sponsored by the Kiwanis Club of Terrace Bay will be held in the Recreation Hall on Saturday evening, June 10th, commencing at 8:15 p.m., when a concert will be given by the Fort William Male Choir conducted by Norman Kleven.

This choir has earned for itself an enviable reputation at the Head of the Lakes and in the surrounding district and their appearance at Terrace Bay should prove a real treat to everyone who is able to attend.

One thing we would like to point out is the fact that the program will not be "high brow". Included in the choral numbers are: Border Ballad; Medowlands; Drinking Song from the "Student Prince"; Big Brown Bear; March of the Toys from "Babes in Toyland"; Birmingham Jail; Song of the Wanderlust; Annie Laurie; The Lost Chord; Shadow March; Steal Away; and Drink To Me Only With Thine Eyes.

Appearing with the choir will be "The Klondyke Quartette" in a varied selection of appropriate numbers and featured also on the program are two soloists, J. Leslie Clark and James Jewitt.

General admission tickets are \$1.00 and may be procured from any Kiwanis Club member, the Imperial Bank, Post Office, Hudson's Bay, Greenwood's, Terrace Groceteria or Hotel Terrace. Any tickets remaining unsold will be available at the door.
