**DON'T BE A CARELESS SMOKER** Last year forest fires alone totalled nearly 5000 and burned 300,000,000 cubic feet of lumber - "the equivalent of half the annual consumption of the Canadian Pulp and Paper Industry."

The following is a list of the principle fire causes and the damage done by each:- Smokers' carelessness - \$3,140,000.00. Overheated stoves, furnaces, boilers and pipes - \$5,000,000.00. Defective electrical wiring and appliances - \$8,000,000.00. Matches, defective or overheated chimneys, hot ashes, open fire, petroleum - \$10,000,000.00. Unknown causes - \$30,500,000.00
