## NEW SAFETY CONTEST GETS UNDERWAY SATURDAY

Commencing at one minute after midnight on Saturday morning, June 24th, a new Safety Contest will get under way involving every person on the LongLac payroll. Units of Departments as broken down in our "Century Club" statistics, published weekly in the News, will compete against themselves to build up consecutive safe days for which cash awards will be paid. Money earned by a unit cannot be forfeited by an accident and may be spent by the unit in any manner except by individual distribution of money.

Each time a unit completes 50 consecutive safe days during the 200-day contest period which runs to January 9, 1951, the unit will receive a cash award of .25 per employee. In addition, bonus awards of .20 per employee will be paid on completion of 200 consecutive safe days.

A unit completing the contest period without an on-duty disabling injury could thereby earn an award of \$1.50 per employee.

Based on National Safety Council standards, an on-duty disabling injury shall end a run of safe days, but a unit may then start immediately to build up a new run of safe days in order to win an award.

The Safety Contest Committee consists of Bill Borsum, Thor Olsen, Ted McInnes, Reg Cotton, Joe Wig, Ron Faust and Fred Soughton.
