TOO MUCH SUGIR

In a talk given by Dr. Jack Shaunessy, D.D.S., before the Kiwanis Club on Tuesday, he told of the huge increase in the consumption of sugar in Canada. Sugar is used extensively in soft drinks, 4 or 5 teaspoons full in a bottle of pop. It is also, as even you know, used in malt beverages and liquor, as well as in candy and the desserts we love too well. Sugar is an energy producing food but we take far too much of it for our own good, if we consider the effect it has on our teeth. The one definite known cause of tooth decay is excessive use of sugar and all of us, particularly the parents, should bear this in mind.

If space would permit, we should like to record in full Dr. Shaunessy's interesting and informative remarks. There are, however, two points which he made that are worth emphasizing as preventative aids against tooth decay. One, that teeth should be brushed within twenty minutes after completing a meal. Second, that we should not give way entirely to that sweet tooth which most of us have, but limit the sugar in our diet.

Health means so much to our happiness, and the condition of our teeth has a considerable bearing on our general health.

TO BLUE CROSS SUBSCRIBERS:

May we again repeat the importance of notifying LongLac Personnel Department where a change of marital status takes place. In the past year many persons have delayed this notification and the signing of forms. If the marriage is not reported within 60 days, no change can be made in the contract until the next semi-annual group opening date, which might mean a decided disadvantage to the subscriber in covering his wife for maternity benefits, or other sickness benefits to which she should be entitled. The onus rests with the subscriber to notify the employer.

Those enlisting in the special United Nations Brigade are also able to have their Blue Cross accumulated benefits held for the time of return to civilian life, provided they comply with certain regulations as to continued payments, etc. This concerns family coverage. Full details are obtainable from the LongLac Personnel Department as a service to employees.
