The Terrace Bay Fire Department asks you to read this message carefully:

DO...

1. Do take time to learn these facts.
2. Do have plenty of Insurance if you smoke in bed.
3. Do keep attic and cellars free from rubbish, papers, and etc.
4. Do check your chimney for cracks and loose bricks.
5. Do use low amp. fuses (15 amps in most cases).
6. Do prevent children from playing with matches.
7. Do dispose of oily rags to prevent spontaneous ignition.
8. Do turn off electric iron when answering door or telephone.
9. Do keep ashes in metal containers, until they are cold.
10. Do eliminate all trash from your yard or garage.
11. Do learn the telephone number of the Fire Department.
12. Do live alone if you use gasoline to clean clothes at home.

DON'T....

1. Don't wait until later to learn these facts.
2. Don't smoke in bed.
3. Don't hang electric light cord over a nail or under a rug.
4. Don't attach wooden aerial pole to chimney.
5. Don't let rubbish accumulate around your home.
6. Don't let soot accumulate in chimney pipes.
7. Don't burn trash in open bonfire.
8. Don't bridge electric fuses.
9. Don't leave electric iron connected and unattached.
10. Don't dump ashes in wooden boxes or barrels.
11. Don't assume that your chimney is safe.
12. Don't keep matches within reach of children.
