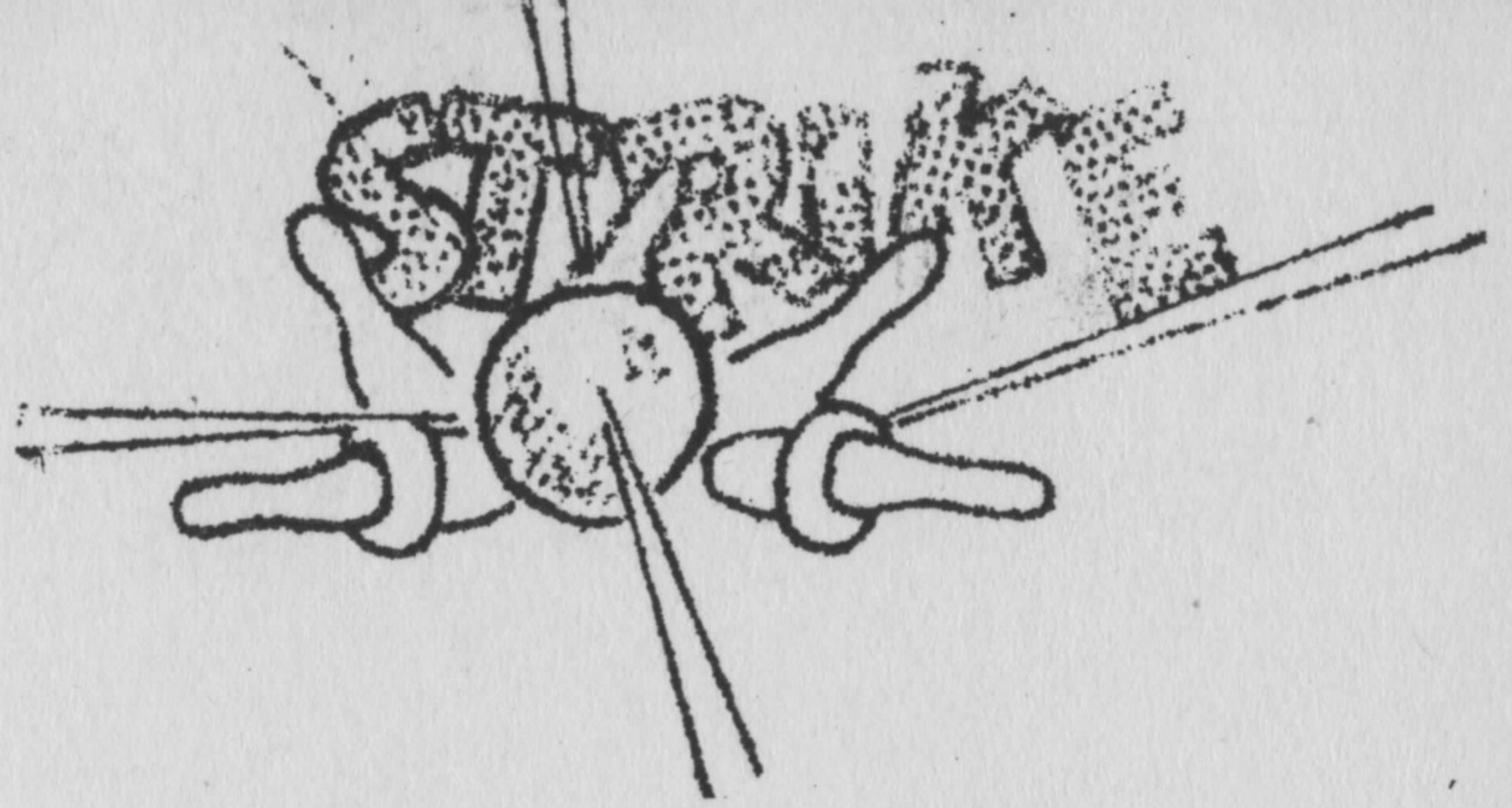


Community Church
