FOR A SAFE AND SANE CHRISTMAS

On the day after Christmas, 1948, at at Richmond Hill, Ontario, five-year old Harold Slater tripped over an electric light cord hooked up to a Christmas tree and a spark flashed into a dry branch. Billowing smoke from the fierce fire that followed killed the little boy and a nine-year old companion.

On the day after Christmas, 1949, at Billings Bridge, Ontario, the Christmas tree in the home of E. J. McEwan exploded into flames, sending three of the seven members of the family to hospital in critical condition.

On the day after Christmas, 1950 - or the night before - or on the great day itself - will a blazing tree bring tragedy to your home?

To avoid a Christmas catastrophe, here are a few simple suggestions:

Keep the tree outside until a few days before Christmas. When you bring it in, keep it moist by cutting the trunk on a diagonal and placing the base in water. Shut off nearby radiators.

Never use lighted candles.

Check the electric wiring for worn spots and loose connections. Don't overload the circuits. Be sure none of the electric bulbs touches a branch. Turn off the tree lights when you leave the house or go to bed.

Remove accumulations of gift wrappings from around the tree. Use only fireproof decorations, never cotton or paper.

And finally, get rid of the tree by New Year's Day.
