"A detailed report of the accident experience at LongLac for 1950 has just recently reached us. Fred Soughton, who calls the shots, prepared it, and its contents are really good. This mill ended its first year's run in 1949 and hung up a frequency of 13.76. In 1950 it finished with 5.91 or 57 per cent better. It is shooting for a still lower figure in 1951, and may get it. In 1949 the mill had a total of 656 man days of lost time, as against 67 in 1950 or 90 per cent better. Compensation payments including medical aid costs were reduced 81 per cent. These reductions were all measured in accordance with standard methods."
