# "CERTIFICATE OF ACHIEVEMENT" WON

Based on its accident prevention experience during the year 1950, the Long-Lac Pulp and Paper Co. Ltd., has been awarded a "Certificate of Achievement" by the National Safety Council in its Annual "Paper Industry Safety Contest". The contest included some 400 separate units which make up most of the pulp and paper industry in the United States and Canada.

"Certificate of Achievement" for reducing its frequency rate from the previous year (56%) and having a rate lower than the average of the group in which it competed. The LongLac frequency rate was 5.91 as compared with an industry average of 10.17. Frequency rate is simply the number of on-duty disabling lost-time accidents per million man-hours worked. In 1950, less than 6 men were involved in lost-time accidents at LongLac for every million man hours worked while the industry average was more than 10.

News of the award was contained in a letter from the National Safety Council, part of which is as follows:

It is indeed a real pleasure for me to congratulate the 1950 contest winners. The announcement of these top-flight safety performances is now being made through the final contest bulletins and all of you people must be very proud of their achievement.
