Three children

Three small children burned to death in their home yesterday. Their mother, Mrs. K. Torneup saw her log home burning. Unable to get through the flames which blocked the doorway, she smashed a window and cut her arm badly in an unsuccessful effort to reach the children. The dead are Ronald, 4; Patricia, 3; and Gary, 2. A fourth child, Cecil, 5, was outside playing. The fire broke out just before noon. R.C.M.P. officers and firemen found evidence that the children had buried their heads under pillows to hide from the smoke and flames.

A Port Arthur woman, after attending a hockey match, found a considerable hole burned in her fur coat, still smouldering at the time of discovery. She believed it due to a cigaret which made contact with the garment during the press of people in the corridors while leaving the rink. Firemen were called to the home of Mrs. E. Morton, 349 Grenville Avenue, shortly after 7 o'clock last night to extinguish a fire burning in clothing under a bed. No damage was done.
