STATISTICS FOR FIRST 3 MONTHS OF 1951

Killed: 15 men, 9 women, 22 children,
Total of 46.

Injured: 65 men, 16 women, 14 children,
total of 95.

Total number of fires - 2864.

Total financial loss of \$4,465,390.00

Insurance claims totalled \$3,733,825.00.

A continuous observance of all phases of fire prevention will reduce this great loss of life and property. Take a look at the record of fires and loss of life and everyone in Terrace Bay please do your part to help in Fire Prevention.
