Last week, we noted three important dates in our current accident prevention program. Today is one of them. Our frequency rate is now down to 4.5 level, equal to the rate which was set as our 1951 objective.

The second important date is May 20th, by which time we could set a new record for consecutive safe days, thereby exceeding the 130 day run established late in 1949. If a new record is set, it will be celebrated by another Community Safety Party or event.

The third important date is May 28th. By that time, we could establish a safe run of a half-million man hours, which would place us on "The Honour Roll" of the National Safety Council.

These dates are important to each and every one of us for when accidents are prevented, it means better living for everybody.

new Sub-Division to be located west of the Hotel to accommodate the new houses. This operation will involve surveying of the site, laying out the lots, installation of sewers, water lines and electricity lines as well as the building of roads and the provision of a sewage disposal system. Other items that come under the Improvement District's wing are the construction of a road from the new C.P.R. Station to the Highway, by way of circling the rear of the houses on Pine Crescent, and general improvements to some of the streets as well as giving a face-lifting to the Parking and Boulevard area in front of the Shopping Centre.

Other projects that have a very definite bearing on the fact that our little town is fast coming into its own, include the proposed opening of the new C.P.R. Station, on May 26th; the Construction of Bucovetsky's Clothing Store, next door to Lumbers' Groceteria. This store will consist of 2 merchandising floors carrying Ladies' and Gent's clothing. The construction of this store and the erection of an apartment duplex to house the staff, is being handled by Knowles Ltd.

Add to the foregoing, the recent opening of an L.C.B.O. Store and the fact that the new Post Office is in its final stages and we realize that before too long Terrace Bay will be one of the most modern self-contained towns in the Province.
