

THE BABY SHOW

Last week the Terrace Bay News carried the news that an event of unusual interest would be held on May 26th - A BABY SHOW - and Miss Mart Brown, General Convenor for this occasion, together with her committee, have arrangements well in hand towards a successful sponsorship on behalf of St. Martin's Club.

The show will be held in the basement of the Church and the entire setting promises to thrill, not only the proud parents participating, but also all others who are planning to drop in and just look around. Briefly, here are some of the highlights.

All contestants will be greeted at a gaily decorated booth at which Miss Dorothy Daniels, as Registrar, will record the name and age of the child and will then be directed to Registered Nurses, Joan Bennett and Mary Hale, where the weighing in ceremony and initial examination will be expertly attended to.

The Judges Stand is the next stop and it may be well to mention, at this point, that the judges will abide by Canadian National Exhibition rules governing Baby Shows so that the most impartial and strictest procedure in the judging may be assured.

Photographer, Len Swirhun, assisted by Mrs. J. J. Corrigan, will have his equipment set up near the judges stand for those desirous of having a photograph taken of their Baby. A nominal fee of 35 cents is being charged for this service, with additional prints available at 10 cents each. All pictures taken will be posed before an appropriate backdrop - and if Len finds time with his lens (pun?), candid pictures of the parents and onlookers will be shuttered just when you're least expecting it.

A cozy little corner in the background will find Mrs. Don Boudreau, Misses Evelyn Orlando and Germaine LeBlanc providing a free Baby Sitting Service, while Mom and Dad are relaxing at the tea tables.

The Tea Booth, roped off at one end complete with a trellised backdrop decorated with Baby centres and sketches, etc. (Miss Glenna Coughlin - Decorator), is being handled by Mrs. J. Adamo as Tea Convenor, with Mesdames R. J. Shemanski and W. E. Cavanaugh pouring. A flat fee of 50¢ will be charged for the tea, which will be the only charge made for the whole show.
