To All LongLac Employees

It gives me a great deal of pleasure to extend congratulations to every LongLac employee for efforts which have made possible the establishment of a new record of consecutive safe days without an on-duty disabling injury. The previous record of 130 days was broken at midnight last Saturday.

The most important thing about the new record is the fact that not since early in January has any LongLac employee suffered an on-the-job injury resulting in lost time based on National Safety Council Standards. During this period, our people have worked almost half a million man hours and this is an achievement of which everyone may be proud.

At the Accident Prevention meeting held last Friday, a new objective of A MILLION SAFE MAN HOURS was set and while such an objective is ambitious, it could be accomplished if every LongLac employee would work without a disabling injury until late September, about four months from now.

I would, therefore, challenge each person on our LongLac Payroll to exercise such caution in the performance of their daily duties as will assure a continued safe operation of this project. If this is done, accidents will be eliminated and the MILLION SAFE MAN HOUR objective achieved.
