

DOMINION DAY CELEBRATION

Plans for the Dominion Day Celebration scheduled for July 2nd are moving into high gear. This celebration, sponsored by the Terrace Bay Accident Prevention Committee, is designed to include all LongLac employees and their families as well as all other Terrace Bay residents. Questionnaires have been circulated to all of the above through LongLac foremen and Community businesses and free tickets will be distributed early next week on a basis of questionnaire returns.

These free tickets, four of which will go to everyone planning on attending, will be good for refreshments such as soft drinks, hot dogs, chocolate bars, ice cream, cracker jack, gum, etc., as well as Bingo and Golf Driving. In certain instances, more than one ticket will be required to procure an item. This will be clearly indicated on the program which will accompany the free tickets.

As for events, a wide variety is planned. One of the highlights, of course, will be the Dress Parade for Kiddies divided into two age groups - 7 years and under and 8 years and over. Each youngster should bring along a decorated tricycle, bicycle or doll carriage. There will also be children's races up to and including the 13 year olds. For students and adults: sock race, couples' 3 legged race and tug-o'-war. For boys and girls 12 - 17, bicycle races. And for the ladies, a husband calling contest.

Tournaments will include golf, horse-shoes and bait casting.

A fish derby is also being considered.

During the afternoon festivities at the Lower Camp Ball Field there will be Bingo, with all proceeds going right back into prizes. Nobody makes a profit on this bingo except the winners.

In the evening a big street dance will be held to climax activities.

In the event of rain, as many activities as possible will be transferred to the Recreation Hall including the bingo and dance.

Throughout the afternoon from 1 p.m. the Lower Camp Snack Bar will be open to disperse the refreshments in exchange for tickets.

All in all it should be a gala day and one which will be long remembered in the community, particularly if the weather man smiles favourably upon the proceedings.
