SAFETY CELEBRATION MONDAY

In the evening a Street Dance will be held near the intersection of the Highway and Kenogami Rd., commencing at 9:30 p.m.

In the event of rain, the Bait Casting Contest and Bingo will be transferred to the Recreation Hall and the Bowling Alleys will be operated. And if it rains, a Movie will be
