TOWNSITE FIRE LLIRM PROCEDURE

Your attention is again drawn to the necessary action to be taken when reporting a fire anywhere here in the Townsite.

Get to a telephone, phone the Fire Hall, (Dial 22) or report direct to the Fire Hall and give the location of the fire, house number if possible. The Fire Phone at the corner of Hudson and Selkirk (mounted on a pole adjacent to Dr. McCausland's house) is connected direct to the Mill Switchboard. When using this phone, give the information to the switchboard operator.

NOTE: When calling from a house phone and the fire hall doesn't answer, Dial 11 or 12 and give the information to the Mill Switchboard Operator.
