MILL AND NORTH CAMP FIRE ALARM PROCEDURE

Any person reporting a fire on the Mill premises should report directly or by phone to the Mill Switchboard Operator, giving location of the fire. If reporting a fire anywhere else in the North Camp area, it should be reported by phone to the Mill Switchboard Operator or to the Fire Hall at 22.

When a fire in the Townsite, South or North Camp is reported, the Townsite siren will be sounded and the location of the fire will be given by a series of blasts on the Mill Whistle. Should there be a power shut-down at that particular time, the Townsite siren will not be sounded, but the location of the fire will still be given on the Mill Whistle.
