### IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR P.S.I. SUBSCRIBERS

(1) Identification Cards and Certificates of Agreement will be delivered with pay cheques in the next few days to hourly paid employees. Salaried employees will have theirs delivered either with pay cheques or through their Supervisors within the next few days.

(2) Only 15 days are to be allowed by P.S.I. for the registration on a subscriber's contract of a new-born child. This means that the subscriber must see that a card has been completed and signed, and turned in to the Employment Supervisor within a maximum of 10 days from the date of birth of the child. This would enable the company to write the necessary letter accompanying the new dependent's registration. Failure of the subscriber to report the child within the prescribed number of days will result in no coverage for the new dependent until the next group opening date. This would be February 15, 1952.

The Hospital will have cards available for completion by parents of children born at Terrace Bay Hospital, but the onus rests on the Subscriber to see that the card is completed and forwarded to the Employment Supervisor at the Mill Administration Building. Such cards may be turned in by a Subscriber to the Operating Personnel Man's office in the Mill if more convenient to the Subscriber, but still should be in within the 10 day period mentioned above.

This is important to you and your family. Please keep it in mind.
