NEW RATES

BLUE CROSS PLAN FOR HOSPITAL CARE

Sharp and continuing increases in hospital costs have made it necessary for the Hospital Association to announce a new rate schedule to take effect October 1st, 1951.

In designing the new rate structure, the Association has taken particular care to make a fair distribution of the subscription rates as they apply to the categories of subscribers using the greatest amount of benefits. Previously, the family rate was twice that of a single person, however, since experience has shown that the ratio of hospital care used by participants in family contracts is greater than two to one, the new rate schedule shows a correspondingly wider spread between single and family charges.

The new monthly rates effective October 1st, 1951, are as follows for semi-private coverage:

SINGLE - \$1.45 - FAMILY - \$3.65
The LongLac Pulp and Paper Company pays
the rate for an employee; employees who wish
to cover their families pay the difference
between the single rate and the family rate.
Under this new schedule, this is the difference ence between \$3.65 and \$1.45 which amounts
to \$2.20 per month.

In cases where a man and his wife are both employed by the LongLac Co., the Company pays twice the single rate or \$2.90, the balance being paid by the employee.
