CREDIT UNION NEWS

Last week we covered what to do and who to see, also the amount of money required, to join the Credit Union. This week we carry on with other points of interest.

Question: How much money can I deposit?

Answer: You can deposit any amount that you wish to but your share Capital only carries insurance up to \$1000.00.

Speaking of insurance on Share Capital, do you know that for every dollar deposited in Credit Union Share Capital before you reach the age of 55 years of age, your beneficiary will receive at death double the amount of your Share Capital. i.e. Suppose that a member has at death \$300.00 Share Capital, his beneficiary will receive \$600.00. That is the \$300. Share Capital plus \$300. insurance. Also, should this member happen to have a loan for say \$200. or any amount at death, or on a doctor's certificate of total disability, he or his estate will receive a receipt from their Credit Union "Paid in Full", and in the case of total disability, the insurance on share capital at death.

All this is at no extra cost to the depositor or borrower. Here the question arises, "Where does this insurance come from?"

Every Credit Union in Canada and the United States of America has banded together to form the Credit Union National Association, more commonly known as CUNA. In this way, we are able to get a very low premium rate on our insurance. At a latter date we will deal more fully with CUNA.
