Rifle Assoc. The new outdoor range being set up by the Local Reserve Unit, be used and that firing points up to 400 yards be added to it. The Dominion Association is open to the public although a local club would be required to be supervised by the Local Reserve Unit.

.303 calibre rifles would be used from Q.M. Stores and 200 rounds of ammunition per year will be supplied free of charge by the Association. A new type of ammunition is now being used that lessens the recoil but does not detract from the muzzle velocity. To start such a Club, it is necessary to have 30 charter members in order that it be a working unit of the Association. To accomplish this, a public meeting of all those in the Community who are interested, has been suggested. Sgt. Davies is available from time to time for his help and suggestions.

On Tuesday evening, new courses of training were started and the attendance is much improved. The lectures are interesting and it looks like we are in for a good season.
