

FIRST ROCKS THROWN!

No games are officially scheduled after Thursday night because of the Christmas holidays and so many people leaving Friday evening. Regarding this and other bonspiel rules, the Draw Committee posted the following notice:

After December 20th, and until further notice, bonspiel games can be arranged between skips and cleared through Ray Williams. When the game is posted on the Club Bulletin Board it is officially scheduled. Games not played on schedule will be forfeit.

Skips may invite another bonspiel skip to substitute if he cannot attend a match, or his third may act in his absence, At least one lady must play in each game on each rink. Substitute players may play in their own or higher bonspiel rating, but not at a lower rating.

Rinks may play with three players, providing one is a lady, and in such cases the first two rink mates will throw three rocks each.

If enough skips can arrange times for meetings we should have settled by New Years, the great question of who eats Turkey, who eats Chicken -- and who eats crow.

Rink fees of one dollar per curler should be collected by the skips and turned over to Paul Boudreau immediately.

We of the Curling Club must be excused for again expressing pride and joy in the new Club House. Now that the piano is moved in, all the furniture is in place, and the
