THE TOWNSITE GROWS

As is quite obvious, there is a great deal of activity going on in and around the Townsite these days. All of this activity is pleasant to note and is a definite sign that the Community is rapidly coming into its own. In the landscaping line, the completion of lawns of the 1946 houses is well underway as is the work on the lawns of the 1951 houses. The erection of a 4-classroom Separate School has been started along with the beginning of a 4-classroom Continuation School complete with a combined Gymnasium-Auditorium that will be used as a community facility. Also in the Recreation line are the improvements underway to provide a full scale baseball and athletic field on the school grounds. Playground equipment has been ordered and will be installed in the new Lakeview sub-division as soon as possible after its arrival. Another welcome sign is the start that has been made on the movie house. This project, when completed, will certainly be one of the most popular spots in town. The completion of the Beverage Rooms in the Hotel is another item that is to be done this year.

Another 35 new houses are under construction in the new sub-division. Also in that area, the grading of Elizabeth, Fort Garry, Lakeview, Superior and Princess avenues is underway. While this is going on, the completion of sewage and water lines for other streets in the sub-division is being taken care of.

Back at the Shopping Centre, concrete walkways are being built in front of the Post Office, the Liquor Store and Bucovet-sky's. Some portions of this area are also being landscaped. The Public School is coming in for its share of attention too, with landscaping planned for the front area and installation of sidewalks.

The programme of exterior house painting will follow its normal routine.

One other item that is being well received by local residents is that of the installation of approximately another 100 telephones in various homes.

Infter reading over this imposing looking list of improvements and additions, a person can only come to one conclusion: We are not standing still in Terrace Bay, progress is being made in no small way!
