KIWANIS CLUB BACKS EFFORT TO CLEAN UP NEWS STANDS

At the regular meeting of the Terrace Bay Kiwanis Club on June 10th, the matter of the increasing amount of obscene and salacious literature and magazines which is appearing on Canadian News Stands was discussed. The following resolution was presented by the Citizenship and Civic Affairs Committee.

"In view of the fact that many of our religious organizations, service clubs and parents are becoming more and more concerned about the increasing amount of obscene and filthy literature and picture magazines appearing on our news stands, be it resolved that the Kiwanis Club of Terrace Bay is unanimously behind any organized effort to protect the morals of our children and that our Government should act accordingly."

This resolution was sent out to both the Rt. Hon. C.D. Howe, M.P. and the Prime Minister of Canada Rt. Hon. L.S. St. Laurent.

A donation was recently received by the Club from 2 girls, Shirley Wesley and Marylin Jensen of Marathon. They made \$10.25 with a travelling basket and have asked to add it to the fund for Crippled Children.
