The following item is reprinted from a recent issue of the Toronto Daily Star:

QUENCH THAT SPARK

Persons who make their livelihood in the woods or in industries made possible by our forest wealth should set an example to the rest of the community in the matter of carefulness with fires. They should not throw away burning matches or lighted cigarette stubs or leave camp fires smouldering. The records show that many of them do.

The most recent number of Sylva, a magazine published by and for members of the provincial department of lands and forests, and written by Mr. Jack Dillon, charges that "fires are definitely caused by settlers, campers, logging operations, smokers, railways, prospectors, incendiarism, and miscellaneous reasons," including lightning.

A single forest conflagration may destroy \$20,000,000 worth of timbers and cheat the government of Ontario out of large amounts of stumpage dues. Carelessness with camp fires and with things that can make the woods a burning inferno that destroys homes, animal life and human beings is criminal.

When a man causes a disastrous forest fire by a moment's thoughtlessness, he cannot excuse himself merely by saying, "I didn't mean to." That is a poor, self-convicting excuse.
