The "Certificate of Achievement" was won in the 1951 Paper Industry Safety Contest sponsored by the National Safety Council's Pulp and Paper Section. It will be accepted by Dan Gillis, President of Local 665, International Brotherhood of Pulp Sulphite and Paper Mill Workers.

Arrangements are being made so that all LongLac employees may attend the ceremony who can be spared from their regular duties. And the ceremony has been planned for 4:00 p.m. at a shift change in order that shift workers who so desire may attend. 1. cordial invitation is also extended to everyone in the Townsite to be present.

Proceedings will include raising an "Iward of Merit" pennant to the top of the Jumbo Bulletin Board flag pole.

Following the ceremony, as a memento " ard of Merit" key chains will be distributed to all LongLac employees by their foremen.
