

SOFTBALL CHATTER

At the time of going to press there are only three teams remaining in the Play-offs. Shift #1 are victorious in the Shift Section, while Salaried and Structural are bitter rivals for supremacy in the Day Section. Perhaps the best way to summarize the results of playoffs to date would be to review all games played:
