BOWLING MEETING MONDAY

Now that the Bowling Alleys have been open for a couple of weeks and all of the bowlers have had a chance to get their "ole arm" in shape, the time has arrived when we must take a few minutes out to sit down and lay plans for the coming season.

Once again, it is hoped that we can have a Ladies, a Mixed and a Men's League in Five Pins and a well rounded-out League of Ten Pin artists.

Three very important items will come up for discussion at this meeting: (1) That a separate League Schedule run from approximately the middle of September to the middle of December (approx. 12 weeks) to accommodate those people who wish to bowl for part of the winter and then switch to Curling for the balance of the season.

(2) In the proposed Ten Pin League, it has been proposed that this league be split into two separate sections: (a) Day Workers, and a Shift Workers section) in order to better accommodate those wishing to bowl as a team. It has also been proposed that the deadline for accepting entries in this League be set at Sept. 15th with the schedule to get underway on Sept. 17th.

(3) That the Bowling Association be set up this year to care for all bowlers, 5 Pinners and 10 Pinnors alike.
