TO ALL TENANTS INSTALLING THEIR OWN OIL BURNERS

The following procedure has been set up to ensure that all Oil-Burner install-ations made by Tenants in Company-owned houses are satisfactory and safe to operate.

- 1. Written permission must be obtained from the Townsite Supt. to install an oil-burner.
- 2. The oil burner installation must conform to the requirements of the National Board of Fire Underwriters, as set out in Pamphlet #31. A summary of these requirements may be obtained from the Townsite Supt. or the Fire Chief.
- 3. Installation must be done under the supervision of a qualified mechanic experienced in making such installations.

  4. When the installation is ready for operation, the tenant must advise the Fire Chief and obtain his Certificate of Inspection and Approval before putting the burner into service.
- 5. All changes required by the Fire Chief shall be made before the Certificate of Inspection and Approval is given and before the burner is put into service.

  6. Any changes made to the Installation after a Certificate of Inspection and Approval has been granted shall be subject to a further Certificate from the Fire Chief before being put into operation.

  7. All parts of the furnace removed to make the installation shall be wired together and nailed to coal bin.

  8. Any tenant vacating the house and removing the oil-burner shall restore the furnace to its original condition, ready
