ROXY THEATRE OPENS SATURDAY

Another "first" in the history of Terrace Bay will be recorded on Saturday, February 7th, when Mr. N. Linkwich opens his new movie house. This addition to our community services will indeed be a welcome one as it means that the journey into Schreiber to see regular movie programmes will be no longer necessary. It will also mean the termination of the old 16 mm movie programmes in the South Camp Recreation Hall that have filled a great need since 1947.

As part of the opening ceremonies on Saturday, Mr. Linkwich or "Nick" as he is better known as to his host of Terrace Bay residents, has arranged to have a supper at the Hotel for a group of invited guests. This event will take place at 7 P.M., following which the party will move over to the new theatre to proceed with the official opening that will get underway at 8:45 P.M. As part of this ceremony, a few short speeches will be made by some of the honoured guests, after which the opening movie programme will be shown.

While all this activity is taking place in the Townsite, a free dance to which the general public is cordially invited will be held in the South Camp Recreation Hall. Music will be supplied by Joe Adamo's band and the hours will be from 9 till Midnight. Mr. Linkwich has arranged to have this dance to accommodate the overflow from the theatre opening, as he does not expect that the theatre will hold all of the people who wish to attend the opening show.

As a special treat for the kiddies, a Free afternoon Matinee will be shown starting at 2:00 P.M. While it is pointed out that this Matinee is intended primarily for the children, if there are any vacant seats left they may be used by any adults wishing to do so.
