SAFETY MEN MEET TODAY

Delegates from 11 Northwestern Ontario pulp and paper mills will meet at Nipigon on May 28th for the 14th meeting of the Northwestern Branch, Ontario Pulp and Paper Makers' Safety Association. The host for this meeting is St. Lawrence Corporation of Red Rock and Nipigon.
